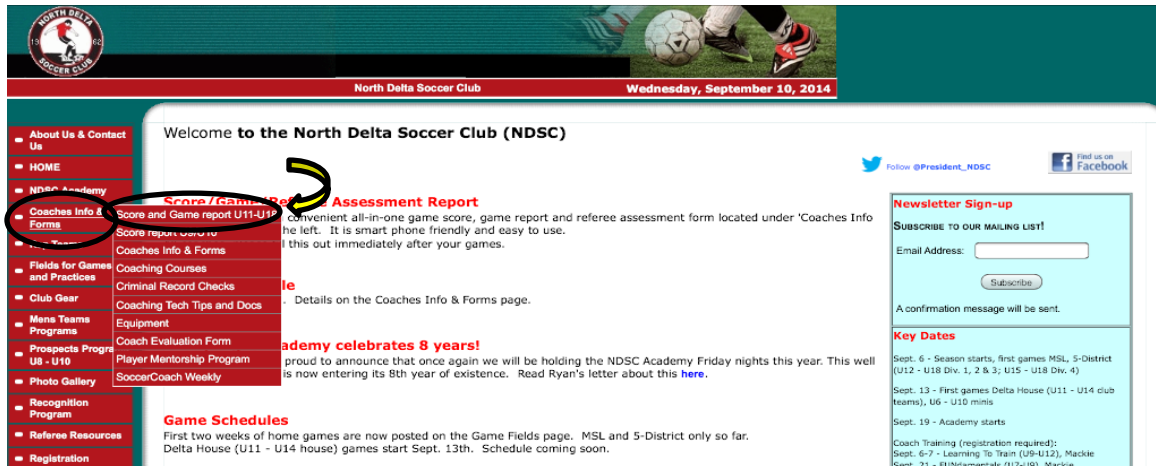


Q & A – SCORE REPORTING U11-U18

For Coaches/Team Managers

Where do I report my scores?

- Go to www.northdeltasoccer.com
- On the left hand side on the website, click on the “coaches info and forms” section
- Then select “Score and Game Report U11-18”



The online Score Reporting form will look like this:

NDSC SCORE REPORTING FOR U11-U18

All scores need to be reported before 6pm on Sunday. Scores reported after 6pm, will not be reported to BC Soccer.

Please complete this form after each game. All scores need to be reported every Sunday by 6pm, so that scores, standings and other statistics can get updated on the BC Soccer website

How are score points calculated?

- 3 points for regulation time win
- 1 point for a tie game
- 0 point for regulation time loss
- 2 points for shoot out win (*Score points calculation from January and onwards - Cup Games*)
- 1 point for shoot-out loss (*Score points calculation from January and onwards - Cup Games*)

Why are the U11 and U12 scores not posted on BC Soccer?

Scores for U11 and U12 are submitted to BC Soccer however they are not posted. Scores are used for tiering purposes only.

Score Confirmation

Coaches need to confirm with the opposing coach at the end of the game and agree on the final score so that they are both reporting the same score to respective Score Keepers. Both clubs reports the scores and if they do not match there will be a delay in getting scores posted.

How do I report forfeit scores?

Forfeit games are reported as “not played - NP”. Coaches must send an email to the Score Keeper with the reasons and circumstances of why the team deserves points due to a forfeit game. This information is then passed to our GM who will contact you directly.

How do I report a Make Up game?

When a makeup game is re-scheduled you need you to ensure that you report the original game date on the Score Reporting form. BC Soccer does not accept make up game scores unless the original game date is submitted.

Do I need to report a cancelled game?

Cancelled games need to be reported on the score keeping form. They will be submitted to BC Soccer as “NP”, not played. If cancelled games are not reported to the Score Keeper, they will be reported as “NR” not reported.

How do I report a “shoot out” score? This applies to Cup Play (January and onwards)

If the game ends in a tie of 1 to 1 and SFC wins the shoot out score, please report score as:

NDS 1 SFC 2 (SFC win SO)

Do I need to report Red or Yellow Cards to the Club’s Score Keeper?

Red/Yellow cards are not reported with scores to BC Soccer however the our NDSC Rep Director & General Manager needs to be informed. Please ensure you input this information on the Score Reporting form if cards are issued to players.

When do scores get reported to BC Soccer?

The NDSC Score Keeper reports all scores received to BC Soccer Central by 10pm on Sunday evening. Once the spreadsheet of all scores is submitted to BC Soccer, it is then updated on their website and scores should be updated by Monday night.

What if my score is posted incorrectly on BC Soccer's website?

Do not email BC Soccer as they will not make any changes unless it comes from the Club's scorekeeper. Please contact NDSC's scorekeeper.

Why does it show NR on the BC Soccer's website in the standings section if my team played?

NR stands for not score not reported. If you reported your score late, NR will be submitted and recorded by BC Soccer.

What does "score conflict" mean on BC Soccer Website?

It means that two scores that were submitted to BC Soccer are different. In this case, it was posted as Score Conflict until the scores have been resolved.
